In those three wins, they scored 33 runs and gave up only three. They are now 12-5 and 3-0 in the district with two district games on the schedule for this week.

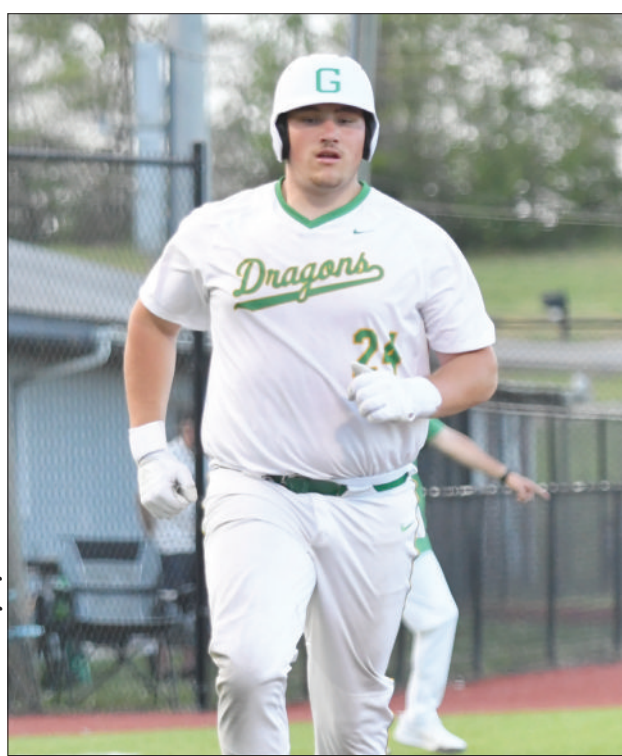
**Adair County 9 Green County 4**  
The Dragons fell behind 5-0 in this game before finally getting on the scoreboard in the top of the sixth inning with two runs. But the Indians scored four more in the bottom of that inning to extend the lead to 9-2. Green County added two more runs in the top of the seventh inning, but it was not nearly enough to overcome the Indian lead. Drew Squires began the sixth inning with a lead off single to left field. Andrew Houk followed that with a home run to center field.

Again in the seventh inning, with two outs and runners on first and second, Squires doubled to score Larson Matney and move Carter Allen to third base. Reese Mitchell was then inserted as a courtesy runner for Allen. Houk reached base on an Adair County error and that error allowed Mitchell to score.

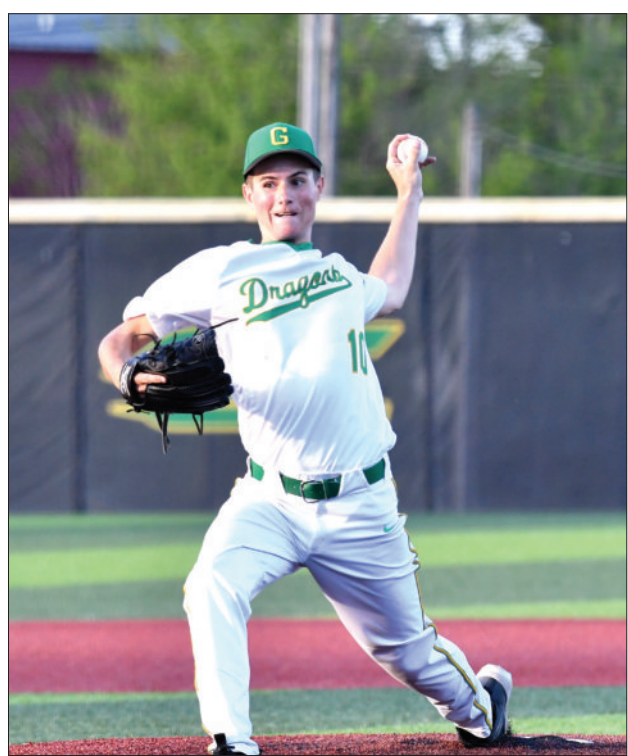
**Green County 11 Monroe County 1**  
The first two innings were slow for both teams, but the Dragons got on the board in the third inning with three runs. Squires, Houk and Keelan Curry crossed the plate in the third inning to take a 3-0 lead. In the fourth inning, Mitchell, Allen, and Cash Jones increased the Dragon lead to 6-1 as Monroe County scored one in their part of the inning. The Dragons continued their scoring outburst with another run in the bottom of the fifth inning. Grif Thomas scored on a sacrifice fly by Matney. The bottom of the sixth inning proved to be the final inning as the Dragons added four more runs to their lead. Squires, Houk, Curry and Mitchell scored the final four runs for Green County to give them the run-rule advantage. On the mound, Squires and Tatum Durrett combined to give up just one run. During the five innings, Squires was pitching, he struck out 11 batters.

**Green County 10 Hart County 0**  
Durrett pitched a three-hit shutout for the Dragons as the picked up another district win over the Raiders. Houk hit his second home run of the week. Jones contributed a triple and Squires hit a double for the extra base hits in the game. Green County scored in the first inning to take a 2-0 lead. They added two more in the third inning and then put the game away with six runs in the fourth inning. In the last ten games with Hart County, Green County has won nine of those games. Three of the last four games, the Dragons have won by a run-rule.

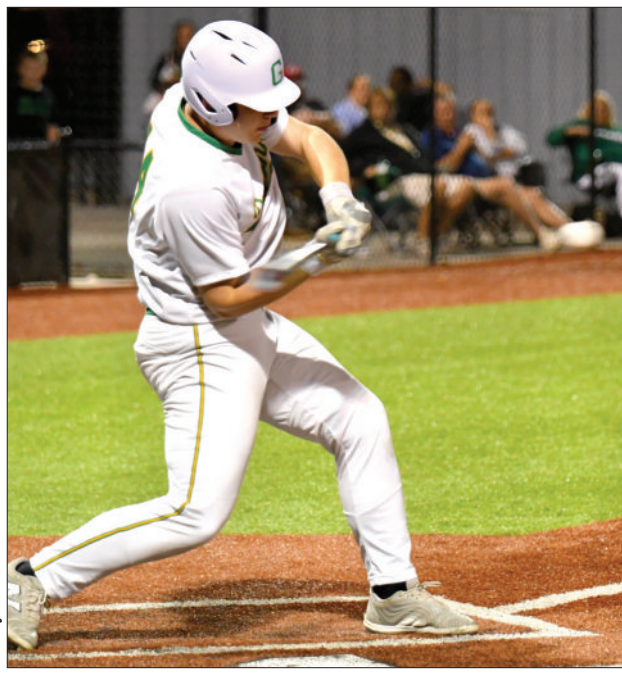
**Green County 12 North Hardin 2**

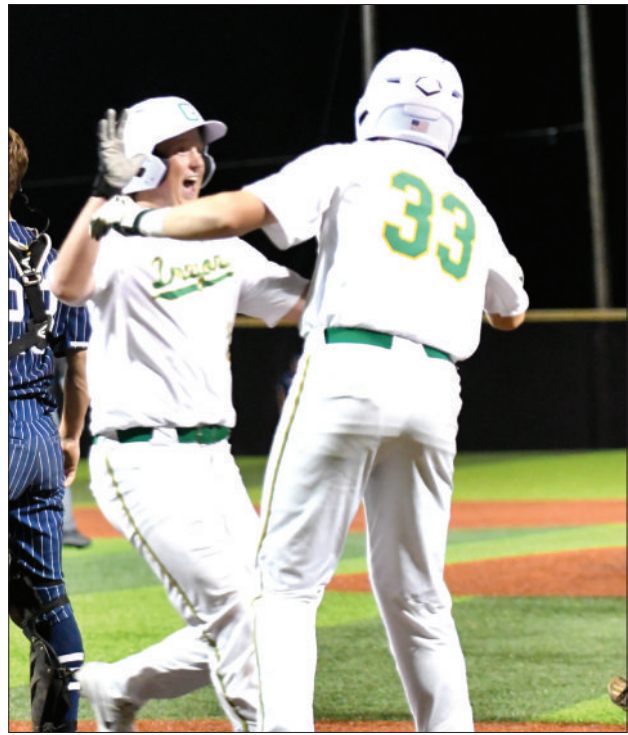
