

Green County Board of Education appoints Dr. Garth Bobrowski to fill Fourth District Seat

The Green County Board of Education is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Garth Bobrowski as the new board member representing the Fourth District.

Dr. Bobrowski is a longtime member of the Green County community and a highly respected leader in both his profession and public service. Locally, Dr. Bobrowski has remained closely connected to the school system, promoting student health and well-being and supporting educational initiatives. He and his wife raised their fam-

ily in Green County, and both of their sons are graduates of Green County High School. He currently has four grandchildren enrolled in the Green County school system.

As he steps into this role, Dr. Bobrowski brings a deep commitment to education and a desire to continue strengthening the school system for future generations. He is passionate about emphasizing the value of education and contributing ideas that support continued growth and improvement across the district.

"We are committed to providing spaces that reflect the pride we have in our schools and the support we have for our students."

Renderings provided by the project architect illustrate the planned structures, including the tennis shelter facility, the new football concession building, and the proposed field-house addition. The designs reflect a cohesive look that aligns with existing district facilities while providing modern, functional space for athletes and spectators.

The next major step in the process is the release of construction bids. Bids are expected to be released in May and opened in June. District officials have prepared preliminary budget estimates of approximately \$4 million for all projects, including the alternate field-house.

Preliminary cost estimates include approximately \$500,000 for the tennis court facility, \$900,000 for the Dragon Stadium concession and restroom facility, and \$750,000 for the concrete sidewalks, stairs, and seating platforms. The proposed fieldhouse is estimated at approximately \$1,350,000, with final approval dependent on bid results.

"We are fortunate to



be in a strong financial position that allows us to continue improving our district facilities," District Finance Officer Zachary Leftwich said. "This project will be financed through bonds, with debt service supported by restricted capital outlay and building fund dollars provided by the state."

Construction timelines and final completion dates will be announced as the projects move through the bidding and approval process. Current expectations are for the concrete seating to be completed prior to the start of football season in August while

the rest of the projects will remain in progress through 2027.

Board members noted that these improvements are part of a long-term effort to enhance district facilities and provide high-quality environments for student participation and community engagement.

"For decades, our community has talked about the need for these improvements and it is exciting to see that vision come to life," Board Chair Marcy Goff said. "This is an investment that will serve our students, families, and community for many years to come."
