

Carl Deaton Classic is Friday

The annual Carl Deaton Classic Track and Field meet will be held this Friday, May 1 at Dragon Stadium. Events contested will include both boys' and girls' 100m dash, 200m dash, 400m dash, 800m run, 1600m run, 3200m run, 300m hurdles, 4 x 100m relay, 4 x 200m relay, 4 x 400m relay, 4 x 800m relay, high jump, long jump, triple jump, pole vault, discus throw, and shot put. Also contested will be the boys' 110m hur-

dles and girls' 100m hurdles. As of Monday morning, schools who have indicated they will attend include Barren County, Campbellsville, Casey County, Cumberland County, Elizabethtown, Fort Knox, Glasgow, Grayson County, Hart County, LaRue County, Marion County, Monroe County, North Hardin Christian School, Taylor County, Washington County, and host Green County. The meet is named after the legendary Greensburg/Green County High School

Track and Field Boys' Head Coach Carl Deaton. His tenure as the head coach of the track and field Dragons was from 1958 through 1993. Coach Deaton was instrumental in track and field becoming one of the athletic programs offered at Greensburg High School. As the boys' head track and field coach, he is credited with 10 conference titles, both SKAC and Heartland Athletic, and one regional title earned in 1972. Several specialty events pay tribute

to deceased former Green County track and field athletes, including Mary Kate Moore in the 1600m run, Justin Hardin in the shot put and Brittany Taylor in the discus throw. Also honored will be Roselyn Deaton, former Greensburg/Green County High School Track and Field girls' head coach, in the long jump, and Bill Moore in the 400m dash, who was Coach Carl Deaton's first track and field regional champion, winning the quarter mile in 1959.
