City of Greensburg to participate in street rating service

The Greensburg City Council, in its regular monthly meeting Monday, April 20, approved to enter into an agreement with Lincoln Trail Area Development District (LTADD) to participate with the development district's Community Asset Planning and Engineering (CAPE) Division providing a pavement condition rating service, Linc Sync.

The total fee for services rendered will be \$3,500.

"Developed by Charlie Allen, the system was adopted by LaRue County Judge-Executive Blake

Durrett. Upon reviewing their results, I felt this was appropriate for Greensburg. It allows us to make informed, unbiased decisions in real time to better serve our community," said Mayor John Shuffett.

The Council also approved Resolution No. 2026-0420 acknowledging the presence of telecommunications facilities in the city's rights-of-way, and that Kinetic ABS KY LLC will continue to locate its facilities within the city's rights-of-way and may continue to do so as long as it proceeds to pay telecommunications tax to the City of Greensburg.

Fiscal Court approves County Road Aid Cooperative Program Agreement

The Green County Fiscal Court, in a special called meeting Thursday, April 23 authorized Judge-Executive John Frank to sign a County Road Aid Cooperative Program Agreement for fiscal year 2026-2027.

"Each year, the Court enters into an agreement with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet regarding county road aid money. This year the county's funds will be reduced to \$975,739.72. This is a \$214,097.08 reduction from last year," said Judge-Executive Frank. "We've already experienced a \$170,000 cut in January of this year. These cuts will greatly affect our road department and the work they do, but we will do the best we possibly can."

In other business, magistrates approved:

(1) A resolution adopting the County Road Aid Cooperative Program Agreement

(2) To contribute \$3,900 in opioid funds to WVLC 99.9FM The Big Dawg based on the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding involving a 12-month campaign with 25 thirty-second radio spots at a cost of \$325 per month

(3) The second reading and adoption of Ordinance No. 26-04-16-2026 relating to Green County Fiscal Court creating a franchise for the operation and maintenance of a telecommunications (non-cable) system in Green County

(4) To advertise for bids on surplus property owned by the county

(5) To contribute \$1,000 to the Taylor County Tourist Commission.
