Drug overdoses decrease

“While we are proud of the progress we have made in fighting addiction, we know we must continue working every day to save more Kentuckians from addiction.”

Other items of note from the report include: --This is the second-largest decrease recorded in the commonwealth since Kentucky began reporting overdose deaths in 2012.

--Fentanyl was present in 45.4 percent of deaths, down from 62.3 percent in 2024. Methamphetamine was present in 49.5 percent of deaths, down from 50.8 percent in 2024. The two continue to be the most prevalent drugs con-

tributing to overdose deaths in the state. --Among Black Kentuckians, 129 deaths in 2025 were attributed to a drug overdose, marking a 25.4 percent decrease compared with 2024. This is the second straight decline among this demographic. “If you or a loved one are struggling with addiction, the KY HELP Call Center can connect you to treatment by calling 833-8KY-HELP (833-859-4357).”
