

Dragons celebrate seniors; win two, lose two

The Dragons improved their record to 11-11 with two wins and two losses last week. This is the last week of regular season play before the district tournament begins at Caverna.

Monday night, Green County matched up with Taylor County in Campbellsville. Despite losing the game 10-8, the Dragons had an opportunity to show their grit after falling behind 7-2 after two innings. Earlier in the season, the Dragons had lost to Taylor County 17-3 but this game was considerably different.

The Dragons jumped out to a quick start when Drew Squires hit a two-run home in the first inning. Squires continued his powerful hitting with another solo homerun in the

third inning. Andrew Houk followed that up with a home run to cut the score to 7-4.

In the top of the fourth inning, Larson Matney doubled to right field, scoring Griff Thom and Carter Allen. Thomas had walked and Allen had been hit by a pitch.

The Dragons trailed by only one at that time. Taylor County added a run in the bottom of the fourth and fifth innings to extend their lead to 9-6.

The sixth inning began with Allen walking to reach first base. Matney singled and Allen advanced to third. Cash Jones hit a sacrifice to left field that scored Allen.

Squires received an intentional walk and Houk walked even though he was pitched to, loading the bases.

Ty Bonta was hit by a pitch which scored Matney, and the bases were loaded again but that was the scoring for the Dragons. Taylor added a run in the bottom of the sixth.

Thursday night, Green County defeated Allen County-Scottsville 9-0.

The offensive play of the night came in the fourth inning when Squires hit a grand slam home run that also scored Reece Mitchell, Braylon Adkins and Matney. That made the score 8-0. Earlier in the game, Braxton Judd scored on a sacrifice by Keelan Curry, in the second inning. Squires hit an RBI single in the third to score Matney. In the fourth, Curry singled to score Judd and Matney walked with the bases loaded to score Curry. It was then that Squires homered.

Mitchell scored again in the top of the sixth inning when Cash Jones hit a single to center field, making the score 9-0.

Friday night, the Dragons lost a heartbreaker to Elizabethtown, 7-6.

The Dragons scored one run in the bottom of the first inning when Matney stole home.

In the fifth inning,

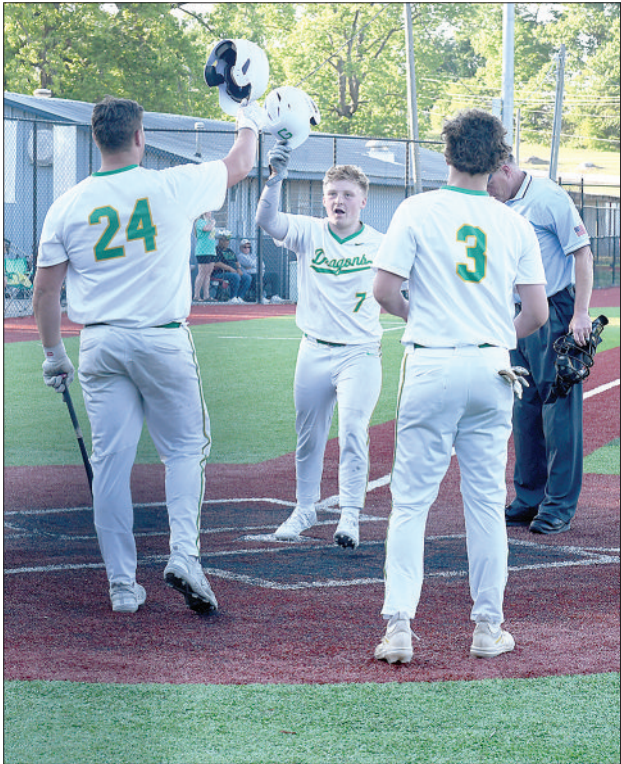
County. This game only went six innings as the Dragons won 14-4.

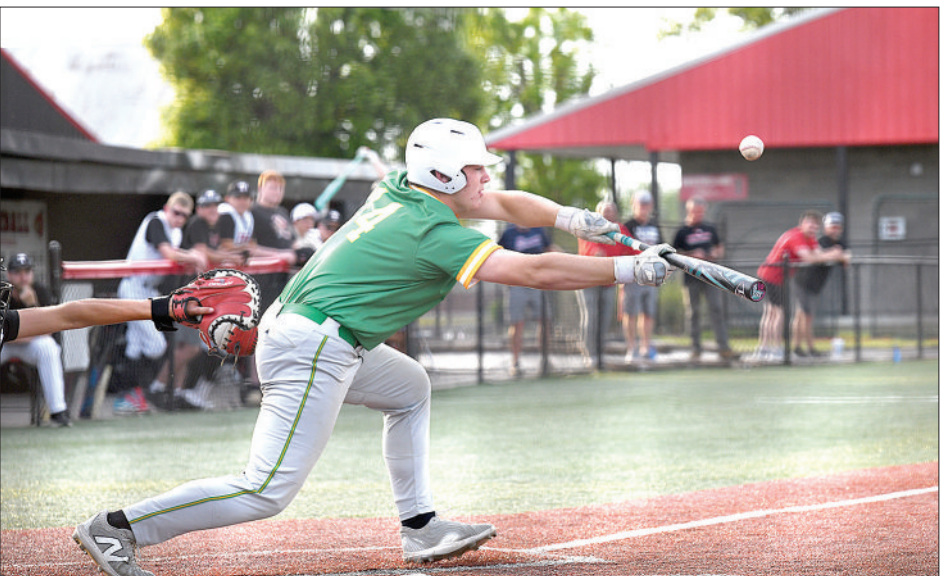

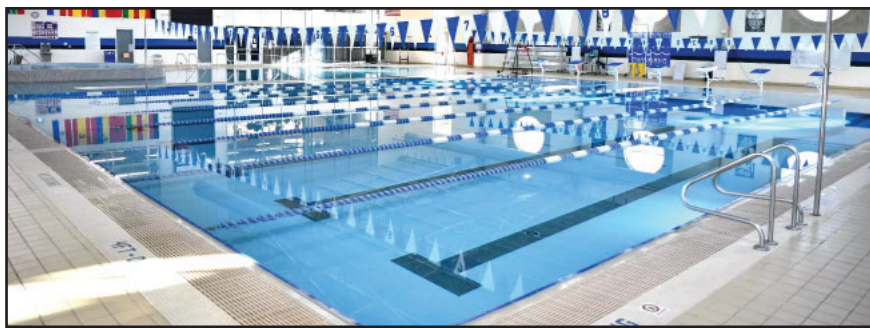

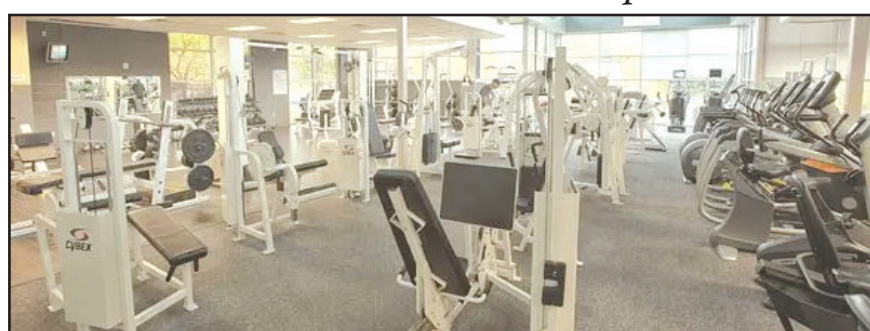
