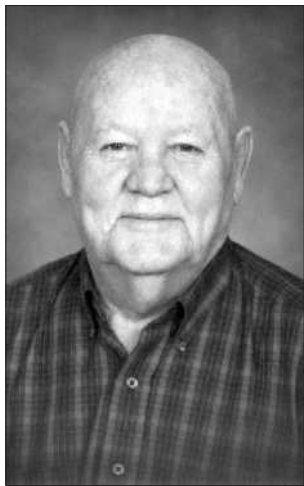


William “Monk” Price, 92
