

GENERAL PROVISIONS - KENTUCKY LIVESTOCK

1. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination. Veterinary Examination certificate shall be void one hundred fifty (150) days after issuance. A certificate of Veterinary Examination means a legible record covering the requirements of the state of destination accomplished on an official form of a standard size from the state of origin or an equivalent form of the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Veterinary Services, United States Department of Agriculture, that is prepared and issued by a licensed, accredited veterinarian.

2. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited or brucellosis certified herds, the certificates of Veterinary Examination shall show accreditation and certification number with date of late herd test for tuberculosis and brucellosis.

3. Livestock infested with warts, ringworms or any infection or communicable disease are not eligible for show.

GENERAL PROVISIONS - OUT-OF-STATE LIVESTOCK

1. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination. Veterinary Examination certificate shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance. A certificate of Veterinary Examination means a legible record

covering the requirements of the state of destination accomplished on an official form of a standard size from the state of origin or an equivalent form of the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Veterinary Services, United States Department of Agriculture, that is prepared and issued by a licensed, accredited veterinarian.

2. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited or brucellosis certified herds, the certificates of Veterinary Examination shall show accreditation and certification number with date of late herd test for tuberculosis and brucellosis.

3. Livestock infested with warts, ringworms or any infection or communicable disease are not eligible for show.

CATTLE

1. Exhibition - Kentucky Cattle

(a) Brucellosis - Animals six (6) months of age or over shall be negative to an official blood test for brucellosis within 150 days of date of exhibition, unless exempt by one of the following

(1) Originate directly from a certified herd.

(2) Official vaccinee under eighteen (18) months of age for all breeds, dairy and beef.

(3) Blood test must be conducted in a state/federal laboratory and must be negative to the APA or card test.

(4) Steers - no brucellosis test required. Must be identified on a

certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Exhibition - Out-Of-State Cattle
(a) Brucellosis - Breeding cattle six (6) months of age or older, except official female brucellosis vaccinees under eighteen (18) months of age for all breeds shall be negative to a card test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days of entry or originate directly and immediately from a certified herd.

(b) A permit is required for exhibition and sales.

(c) Steers for carcass classes shall be positively identified, but no brucellosis test is required and must be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

(d) Tuberculosis

1. Cattle six (6) months of age or older shall be negative to an official tuberculin test within sixty (60) days of entry of originate directly and immediately from an accredited herd of a TB-free state. TB-free state status must be stated on the certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Reciprocal agreement with adjoining states may be effective in lieu of specific requirements.

3. Steers for carcass classes shall be positively identified, shall not be required to be tuberculosis treated if originating from a TB-free state or from an accredited herd and MUST BE accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

3. Other Disease Requirements

(a) Animals infected with warts, ringworm, pink eye or any infectious or communicable diseases are not eligible for entry.

HORSES - KENTUCKY AND OUT-OF-STATE

1. All OUT-OF-STATE horse shall be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination issued by a state, federal or licensed accredited veterinarian within the past thirty (30) days and such certificate must include:

(a) Veterinarian's statement that an examination has revealed the animal to be free from symptoms of any infectious or contagious disease or exposure thereto, and

(b) That the Equine Infectious Anemia test was conducted at a state or federally approved laboratory within the past twelve (12) months and a copy of this test must accompany the certificate of Veterinary Examination.

All horses for SALE are to have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the past six (6) months and accompany the certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. KENTUCKY horses offered for exhibition shall have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the past twelve (12) months and a copy of the test must accompany the animal.

All horse for SALE are to have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test with the past six (6) months and accompany the certificate of
