

Veterinary Examination.

SWINE - KENTUCKY

1. All swine for exhibition must be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Brucellosis-Negative 150 day (APA or card test). All swine except barrows six (6) months of age or older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 150 days of date of show or originate directly and immediately from a validated herd. Validation number and date of last herd test must be shown on the certificate of Veterinary Examination.

3. Pseudorabies - all animals including barrows and market gilts must be serologically negative to an official test for pseudorabies within 150 days prior to exhibition or from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd and be accompanied by a statement by the veterinarian that no pseudorabies has occurred on the premises in the past six (6) months.

SWINE - OUT-OF-STATE

1. All swine for exhibition must be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Brucellosis- All swine for breeding purposes (6) months of age or older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days of date of entry or originate directly and immediately from a validated herd provided the animals to be imported

were tested on last validation herd test. No agglutination in dilution of 1-50 shall be accepted unless the individual or individuals to be imported are negative to an official (APA or card test).

3. Pseudorabies - all animals including barrows and market gilts must be serologically negative to an official test for pseudorabies within thirty (30) days prior to exhibition or from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd and be accompanied by a statement by the veterinarian that no pseudorabies has occurred on the premises in the past six (6) months.

4. All swine must be identified by ear tag or ear notch to the farm of origin.

5. No swine will be admitted from a state that has areas under state/federal quarantine.

SHEEP - KENTUCKY

1. All sheep and lambs consigned shall be identified individually by ear tattoo or ear tag. Such identification shall be entered on a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Scrapie - no sheep or lambs shall be consigned that originated from or are known to be exposed to flocks under surveillance for scrapie.

3. A statement by the veterinarian issuing the certificate of Veterinary Examination verifying that no clinical scrapie has occurred in the origin flock within the last 18

months and no animal or animals from the flock or origin has had positive scrapie confirmed by the National Veterinary Service Laboratory within the last 18 months.

4. Sore mouth - any sheep or lambs showing lesions of contagious exythma shall not be consigned.

SHEEP - OUT-OF-TOWN

1. Exhibition and Shows

(a) All sheep and lambs consigned shall be identified individually by ear tattoo or ear tag. Such identification shall be entered on a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Specific Diseases

(a) Scrapie - no sheep or lambs shall be consigned that originated from or are known to be exposed to flocks under surveillance for scrapie.

(b) A statement by the veterinarian issuing the certificate of Veterinary Examination verifying that no clinical scrapie has occurred in the origin flock within the last 18 months and no animal or animals from the flock or origin has had positive scrapie confirmed by the National Veterinary Service Laboratory within the last 18 months.

(c) To-date Kentucky requirements.

(d) Sore mouth - any sheep or lambs showing lesions of contagious exythma shall not be consigned.

Scabies - all sheep and lambs breeding or feeding purposes imported from a farm, ranch or like premises shall be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary Examination indicating such sheep and lambs originated directly and immediately from an official scabies eradicated free area.

GOATS - KENTUCKY

1. All goats consigned shall be identified individually by an ear tattoo or ear tag. Such identification shall be entered on a certificate of Veterinary Examination.

2. Scrapie - no goats from a herd under surveillance for scrapie or those that are known to have been exposed to or that are progeny shall be consigned.

3. A statement by the veterinarian issuing the certificate of Veterinary Examination, must verify that no clinical scrapie has occurred on the origin herd within the last 18 months and no animal or animals from the herd of origin has had positive scrapie confirmed by the National Veterinary Service Laboratory within the last 18 months.

4. Brucellosis - animals of the dairy breed six (6) month of age or older shall have a negative (APA or card test) in the last 150 days or originate directly and immediately from a certified herd.

5. Tuberculosis - no test required on Kentucky goats.
