

Lady T-Wolves Push Win Streak To 9 Games

The Midland Lady Timberwolves continued their impressive run this week as they stretched their school record winning streak to nine games and also set a school record with their 22nd win of the season, breaking the record held by the 20-win team back in the 1998-99 season.

The week started out on Monday as Midland cruised to a 56-35 win over Indian Creek. Indian Creek came into the game with a 12-10 record but found themselves trailing 22-0 after the first quarter and 32-7 at the half. Midland held a 49-26 lead heading into the final quarter.

Anna McGlasson led the way for Midland as she tallied 19 points, including a 7 for 7 performance from the free throw line. Jordyn Pyles added double figure scoring with 12.

On Thursday, the girls closed out the home portion of their schedule as they took a 53-46 decision over a talented Dwight team.

Dwight led 13-10 after the first quarter, but Midland held the Lady Trojans to just a field goal and two free throws in the second quarter as Midland took a 24-17 lead at the half. Midland led 36-32 heading into the final quarter. Two 3-pointers by Ella Foster and Midland converted 4 of 6 free throws down the stretch as they held on to the 53-46 win.

Anna McGlasson tallied 20 points to lead the team. Ella Foster added double figure scoring with 12 points.

Finally on Saturday, Midland jumped out to a 21-6 first quarter lead enroute to a 62-38 win over Fieldcrest. Midland led 36-17 at the half and 55-31 heading into the final quarter.

Anna McGlasson once again led the way with 18 points. Jordyn Pyles and Emma Franks added double figure scoring with 16 and 12 points respectively.

TeriLynn Timmerman led Fieldcrest with 20 points. Fieldcrest's leading scorer, Macy Gochanour has been sidelined with an injury.

Midland will close out their regular season week when they host Marquette on Thursday. The game was originally set to be played in Marquette but was moved to Midland when the Marquette gym was flooded over the winter break due to a pipe bursting.

Midland will begin play next week in the Serena regional. Midland drew the #1 seed and will face the Henry-Earlvile winner on Monday, February 16 at Serena at 6:00 p.m.

Timberwolves Have 0-3 Week Against A Trio Of Talented Teams

The Midland Timberwolves dropped a trio of games this week to some pretty good teams, losing conference games to Woodland and Marquette and falling to former Tri-County member Peoria Christian on Tuesday. The three teams had a combined 50-19 record heading into their games with Midland.

On Monday, Midland battled a talented Woodland team but came up short as they dropped a 65-58 decision.

The Warriors built up a 32-22 halftime lead. Midland battled back as Dom Rosa tallied 12 third quarter points to make it close as Woodland led by just 6 at 49-43 heading into the final quarter.

The Warriors converted on 5 of their 8 free throws down the stretch to take the 65-58 win.

Dom Rosa led the way for Midland as he tallied 19 points. Landon McFadden added double figure scoring with 13.

On Tuesday, the Peoria Christian Crusaders jumped out to a 21-5 first quarter lead, then extended that to 43-17 at the half as they cruised to the 77-55 win.

Zach Allen led the way for Midland as he tallied 18 points, 15 of those coming in the third quarter. Dom Rosa added double figure scoring with 15.

Finally on Friday, Marquette was able to pull away from the Timberwolves in the fourth quarter as they cruised to a 70-55 win.

Midland hung tough in the early going as they trailed 16-14 after the first quarter and 36-28 at the half. It was a 48-40 game heading into the fourth quarter.

The Crusader went to the free throw line 18 times in the fourth quarter, converting 11 of them, enough to pull away to the 15-point win.
