Here's some desserts to serve with your Valentine dinner.

Best-Ever Chocolate Cake  
3 c. flour  
2 c. sugar  
6 Tbsp. cocoa  
2 tsp. soda  
1 tsp. salt  
2 c. water

2/3 c. vegetable oil  
2 tsp. white vinegar  
2 tsp. vanilla  
Fluffy Chocolate Frosting:  
1 c. cold milk  
8 oz. frozen whipped topping, thawed  
1 pkg. instant chocolate pudding mix  
Combine the first 5 ingredients. Add the water, oil, vinegar and vanilla. Beat for 1 minute. Pour into a greased 9"x13" baking pan. Bake at 350° for 40-45 minutes. Cool.

Frosting: Beat the milk and pudding mix for 2 minutes. Beat in whipped topping. Spread over cake.

Mint Chocolate Cake  
1 chocolate cake mix  
Mint Frosting:  
1/2 c. butter, softened  
1 tsp. peppermint flavoring  
3 c. powdered sugar  
1 Tbsp. milk,  
green food coloring  
Chocolate Topping:  
1/2 c. butter  
1 lb. chocolate chips  
Put a chocolate cake in a 12"x17" sheet cake pan. Bake at 350°. Cool. Chocolate Topping: Melt together on low heat. Put mint frosting on cooled cake, then add chocolate topping.

Strawberry Heart Cake  
1 box white cake mix  
1 pkg. strawberry Jell-O  
3 Tbsp. flour  
1/3 c. vegetable oil  
4 eggs  
1 pkg. frozen, sweetened strawberries, thawed  
1/2 c. cold water  
1/2 c. butter, softened  
5-5 1/2 c. powdered sugar  
Combine cake mix, Jell-O and flour. Beat in oil and eggs. Drain strawberries, reserving 1/2 cup syrup for frosting. Add berries and water to batter; mix well. Divide batter between 2 (1 square and 1 round) waxed paper lined 8" baking pans. Bake at 350 for 30-35 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes then remove from pans to cool completely. Combine butter and reserved syrup. Gradually add sugar, beat until fluffy. Place square cake diagonally. Cut round cake in half. Frost cut sides and place against the top two

sides of square cake, forming a heart. Frost sides and top of cake. Decorate with red hots around the edge.
