The Coffeeville School District will accept sealed bids for hunting and fishing rights on the following parcel of Sixteenth Section Land:

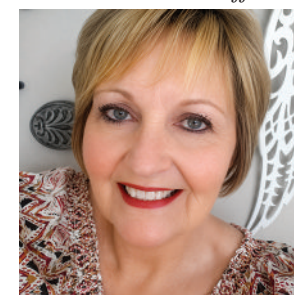
319.5 acres located in Section 28, Township 26N, Range 4E. (Hunting and Fishing)
